



Remote Education Plan for children in Self Isolation

Some children may not attend school at this time due to underlying health reasons or may have to self isolate at home for a given time. These children should still be given the opportunity to participate as much as possible in daily learning activities.

Identifying Children Learning from Home

- Parents to inform the office if their child(ren) will be learning from home due to health or necessary self isolation
- Office Staff to identify whether the child(ren) will require a device or internet dongle from school to support learning at home
- Office to inform SL, who will keep a record of children, and inform the class teacher

Distance Learning for Individuals Learning at home

The LEO Central Team will be responsible for allocating learning to children who are unable to attend school during the pandemic. Further information to be included.

Distance Learning for individuals self isolating or 2 weeks

It will be the responsibility of class teachers to set daily learning for pupils learning at home. Where possible, tasks should be in line with the learning being completed by pupils in school and should therefore not be in addition to what is already planned for. Reading, Maths and English should be set each day with Phonic lessons being set x3 weekly and Reading Comprehension x2 weekly. Wellbeing activities should also be made available each week to support pupils at home.

Assemblies

Y2-6 pupils should be given a link to participate in Achievement and SEAL assemblies each week. (Year 1 after half term) These would be the same recorded assemblies taking place in school as per the timetable.

Phonics

Use Mr Thorne Videos to share and teach new sound/ tricky words being taught that week. Provide children with words to read and write. Tricky word lists to practise reading and writing may also be linked.

Reading

Pupils in KS1 and KS2 can complete daily reading on Collins Connect. Parents/carers will be given a user name/password in September. Free Readers in Upper Key Stage 2 can be provided with x3 year group novels can be collected from school and returned when the child returns to school. These books must be wiped down and left for at least 72 hours before being returned to the class.

KS1 & 2 should send x2 comprehension activities (including teacher boards to explain and model) each week. These should be the same activities completed with pupils in school.

English (inc. spelling) & Maths

Oak National Academy Lessons - CTs to work with English/Maths leads to try to match the learning to what is being covered in school over that time where possible.

Topic

This learning should be in line with the learning being completed by pupils in school for non-core subjects. Please ensure that resources needed for lessons would be available at home.

Wellbeing

Weekly task format for children to access when they want/need to.

Marking & Assessment

Parents/carers are advised to return any work completed to the Manor Park Year Group Email addresses. These will be checked regularly by the class teacher and work acknowledged.

Distance Learning for Local Lockdown

If a local lockdown is put into place, learning will resume on the LEO Distance Learning Website. Any changes to this will be communicated to teachers at the time.
